Who Should Attend?

The two-day workshop is designed for District and Organization Leaders for Partnerships who will directly facilitate schools to improve their programs of family and community engagement.

NNPS defines a Facilitator for Partnerships as a specialist who will directly assist school-based Action Teams for Partnerships (ATPs) to plan. implement, and evaluate their programs of family and community engagement. Leaders help schools work well with their own students' families.

State leaders will plan how to inform and guide district leaders to work well with their own schools' ATPs on goal-linked programs of family and community engagement for student success.

The Leadership Institute is <u>not</u> for principals, parents, or teachers who work with only one school. It is designed for leaders who will guide multiple schools' ATPs to use NNPS research-based approaches to strengthen and sustain programs of family and community engagement.

By completing this institute, YOU will be able to:

- Describe the NNPS model and conduct an NNPS One-Day Team Training Workshop for schools' Action Teams for Partnerships (ATP).
- Evaluate a One-Year Action Plan for Partnerships at the school level.
- Describe the roles and responsibilities of district Leaders for Partnerships.

School-based Action Teams for Partnerships (ATPs) select involvement activities that create a welcoming school climate and that are linked to school improvement goals for students (e.g., improve skills in reading, math, science, and other subjects, attendance, behavior, health, and postsecondary planning).

District, organization, and state members of NNPS conduct leadership activities to organize their work and guide schools' partnership programs. Leaders help schools organize ATPs to engage ALL families and community partners in ways that support student learning and development at all grade levels..
