TIPS Volunteers in Social Studies and Art in the Middle Grades



Teachers Involve Parents in Schoolwork (TIPS) Volunteers in Social Studies and Art help schools organize productive volunteers in the middle grades. Teachers and parent or community volunteers work together to enrich the social studies curriculum with art appreciation experiences for all students. For example, when students study American history, they study American artists and artwork in monthly presentations. When they study world history, they examine the work of artists from around the world. Units on Government and Citizen Participation are linked to artwork on this themes. Other social studies units may be developed using these materials as prototypes.
