Dear Colleague:

You are invited... You are invited to join the National Network of Partnership Schools (NNPS) at Johns Hopkins University. NNPS invites schools, districts, states, and organizations to work together to improve their leadership and programs of school, family, and community partnerships. Based on more than three decades of research and field tests, we know that this goal can be attained by all elementary, middle, and high schools, and that district, state, and organization leaders can play important roles in assisting schools to improve partnerships in ways that increase student success.

About NNPS... NNPS guides school teams of educators, parents, and community partners to use research-based approaches including an Action Team for Partnerships and the framework of six types of involvement (parenting, communicating, volunteering, learning at home, decision making, and collaborating with the community) to plan and conduct comprehensive partnership programs. Researchers and facilitators at Johns Hopkins University train and assist school, district, state, and organization leaders to understand, implement, evaluate, and continually improve goal-oriented programs of partnerships. The purpose is to ensure a welcoming climate, improve student attendance and school behavior, and increase student achievement, graduation rates, and readiness for college or career.

NNPS presently includes over 500 schools, districts, organizations, and state departments of education that want to apply research to improve the quality of family and community involvement and results for students. The NNPS website, www.partnershipschools.org, includes information on key program components (see NNPS Model), research summaries, and examples of outstanding programs and practices (see Success Stories.) See the list of benefits, levels of membership, details on "Why NNPS?", and membership forms in the section Join NNPS.

Requirements... Schools, districts, states, and organizations that join NNPS must meet a few requirements described on the membership form. Our research identified 8 essential elements of successful programs: leadership, teamwork, written plans, implemented action, funding, collegial support, evaluation, and networking. NNPS will assist you in developing all of these essential elements for a research-based program that will improve from year to year.

Fees. . . NNPS charges modest fees for many benefits and services.

- There is a professional development and processing fee of \$500 for each school, district, state, and organization, which must accompany each membership form.
 - See options for districts, states, and organizations to join NNPS at the **Member** or **Partner** level.
- NNPS district, state, and organization leaders are invited to attend a 2-day Professional
 Development Institute in Baltimore or online in the spring or fall to prepare to be experts on partnership programs and to facilitate schools in developing excellent programs of family and community engagement.
- There is an annual renewal fee of \$250 per member to continue membership benefits and services from year to year, including an annual evaluation of program progress.

Benefits... The National Network of Partnership Schools offers many benefits and services to help members increase their knowledge and develop skills in developing effective programs of partnerships for student success. These are provided as part of membership, unless otherwise noted. Benefits include:

- Comprehensive handbook. School, Family, and Community Partnerships: Your Handbook for Action, Fourth Edition includes summaries of research, guidelines for workshops on partnerships, presentation PowerPoint on CD, an inventory of starting points, planning and evaluation forms, and other tools to help develop and strengthen your partnership program. The CD includes materials in English and Spanish.
- **Certificate of membership.** This recognizes your commitment to developing a goal-linked program of school, family, and community partnerships.
- **Monthly** *E-Briefs* from NNPS Facilitators with information and resources for on-going program development.
- **On-call consultations with NNPS staff.** Members may contact NNPS at any time by phone, e-mail, or website to ask questions or request information about partnership program development.
- Excellent website www.partnershipschools.org. The NNPS website is chock full of information on partnerships; research summaries; examples of best practices in elementary, middle, and high schools, districts, states, and organizations; and more.
- *Type 2 Blog*. Each *Blog* features a summary of new research, examples of good practices, or guidelines for continuous progress in partnership program development. *Type 2 Blog* is e-mailed to all NNPS Key Contacts and is posted on the website.
- Annual evaluations. The annual *UPDATE* survey enables members to assess their program's progress each year. NNPS collects the data and provides summaries of *UPDATE* data from schools and districts to all members to use in their own evaluations of family and community engagement. The annual renewal fee covers data collection, processing, analysis, reporting, customized reports to districts, and all other membership benefits for the next school year.
- *Promising Partnership Practices*. The annual e-book spotlights activities from schools, districts, states, and organizations in NNPS. All members may submit a best practice for consideration in each book. Each member-site receives a copy by email and the e-book is posted on the NNPS website in the section *Success Stories*.
- *Partnership Awards*. NNPS recognizes schools, districts, states, and organizations that demonstrate excellence in implementing research-based approaches to improve their programs of school, family, and community partnerships for two years or more.
- Other tools, materials, and webinars. NNPS designs and develops new guidelines and training activities each year to assist you with your work on school, family, and community partnerships.
- Leadership Development Institutes (registration fee required). NNPS conducts a 2-day intensive professional development Institute for district, organization, and state leaders in the fall and spring in Baltimore or online. The Institute helps leaders establish and improve their partnership programs and effectively facilitate schools to work with their own students' families.

Why should you join? NNPS will help your district, school, state, or organization become a national leader in conducting school, family, and community partnerships that contribute to school improvement goals. NNPS's research-based approaches help create a welcoming school environment, strengthen families, and increase student success in school. These approaches enable schools, LEAs, and SEAs to meet Title I and other policies for family and community engagement. In NNPS, members network with each other to learn about and share successful partnership practices.
