Teachers Involve Parents in Schoolwork (TIPS) enables teachers to engage all families with their children in positive conversations about homework. Students are guided to show, share, and discuss something interesting that they are learning in class. Parents can see what their children are learning via the weekly TIPS interactions. Each activity includes a section for Hometo-School Communications so that parents may send reactions or questions to the teacher.

In countless surveys with diverse populations, parents ask for more and better guidance on "how to help my child at home." TIPS activities are conducted by the student, and so parents are not asked to "teach" school subjects. Indeed, with TIPS, more parents gain confidence about helping their child at home and, spurred by positive interactions, more students complete their assignments.
