CREATE AWARENESS

Promote state, district, and school programs of family and community engagement to key stakeholders.



ALIGN PROGRAM & POLICY

Integrate partnership plans and practices with official policies, strategic plans, and goals for student success. Help districts guide schools to implement state policy.



GUIDE LEARNING & PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

Organize, conduct, and/or support professional development and on-going technical assistance to help district leaders and school teams strengthen their partnership plans and practices over time.
