Welcome back to the 2022-23 school year! This will be *the* year to design and implement partnership activities focused on student success. Despite some vestiges of COVID, things are shaping up as "new normal." NNPS will stay connected with you in our monthly *E-Briefs*. THEME FOR THE YEAR. NNPS selects a theme each year to feature in *E-Brief*. Last year, we focused on the NNPS 25th Anniversary and the progress we made in theory, research, and practice over the years with leaders—like YOU! In the 2022-23 school year our theme is:

Students' Roles in School, Family, and Community Partnerships

Too often, students' roles in partnership activities are ignored. But students are the MAIN REASON for teachers, parents, and other partners to connect. Students are the main focus of official policies on partnerships. This year—in this space—we will feature examples of NNPS members' activities that give students important roles for successful family and community engagement. Students may be inviters, presenters, guides, performers, demonstrators, evaluators, or take other roles. We will feature activities from different sections of the new e-book, *Promising Partnership Practices 2022*.

We start this month with an activity in the Reading and Literacy section: Cops and

Pops reported by Tamula Dunmeyer, Key Contact to NNPS at **Chicora Elementary School**, Charleston County School District, South Carolina.

Fathers, father figures, and partners from the local police department signed up as reading buddies to more than 50 fifth-grade boys. They all read *The Stars Beneath Our Feet*—about a boy entering adolescence and the challenges he faces. Teachers provided questions for each pair to discuss as they read two-chapters at a time. Students increased thinking skills, vocabulary, and reading comprehension skills. They really enjoyed the book and their new reading partners.

Why is this a good example of students' roles in partnership activities? *Cops and Pops* focuses on increasing students' reading skills and positive attitudes. It builds relationships between students, dads, and community police. It gives *both* the adult volunteers *and* each student "say so" on *whether or not they want to return for their next meeting as reading buddies*. 

INFORMATION, OPPORTUNITIES AND RESOURCES

U.S. Department of Education, summarizes important data collected over the past two years. Results of national studies show that students' achievement and socio-emotional well-being were negatively impacted by school closures and requirements for remote learning. The negative effects of learning from home were strongest for students in marginalized racial groups and in families with low incomes.
