THEME FOR THE YEAR. NNPS selects a theme each year to feature in *E-Brief.* Last year, we focused on Students' Roles in School, Family, and Community Partnerships. This year our theme is: **Tools You Can Use**. We will remind you about a useful NNPS resource each month that district leaders and school teams use to continually improve their partnership programs. And so can YOU!

Tools You Can Use: Start the year by guiding school ATPs to explore *Starting Points,* a quick inventory of present practices—pp. 175-178 / Chapter 5 in *School, Family, and Community Partnerships: Your Handbook for Action.* Members of the ATP may quickly examine the sections on the six types of involvement (Type 1-Parenting, Type 2-Communicating, Type 3-Volunteering, Type 4-Learning at Home, Type 5-Decision Making, and Type 6-Collaborating with the Community).

- Check the engagement activities in each section that the school already conducts
- Check one engagement activity in each section the ATP wants to consider adding to the *One-Year Action Plan for Partnerships* to extend information and services to more families—including those previously "hard to reach."

Why is this a good tool to use? *Starting Points* helps every ATP see that it already has started to strengthen the school's partnership program in many ways. No school is starting from "ground zero." At the same time, there is always room for improvement!
