Tools You Can Use.

All school ATPs should use the *Annual Evaluation of Activities* to reflect on the success of each family and community engagement activity that they implement. See this tool on pp. 248-352 (Goals Plan) and pp. 353-359 (Types Plan) in Chapter 9 of the NNPS *Handbook for Action*.

The evaluation pages are exactly parallel to the pages of the *One Year Action Plan for Partnerships* (i.e., Page 1 of *Plan* matches Page 1 of *Evaluation*.). This makes it easy for ATPs to discuss each family engagement activity that is implemented throughout the school year. (The forms are printable from the CD in the back of the *Handbook* or from the [publisher's downloadable site](#)).

Why is this a good tool to use? [*Annual Evaluation of Activities*](#) helps every ATP learn that it is fun and profitable to talk things over—as a team—after implementing each family and community engagement activity. The short evaluations accumulate over the school year by recording which activities went well, which need to be redesigned to reach more and different families, and which improved the school climate and contributed to student success. This helps ATPs decide whether to repeat, improve, or think “new” in their *One Year Action Plan for Partnerships* for the next school year.

Story Time with Pastors was designed and implemented by **Little Rock School District (LRSD), Arkansas**, to reinforce district goals to improve reading skills and reading attitudes in the elementary grades. A community partner—a local radio show host—saw potential in encouraging pastors whom she had interviewed to volunteer to bring stories, wisdom, and good will to the children in LRSD.

The district's office for Volunteers In Public Schools (VIPs), worked with others to champion this connection, and set *Story Time with Pastors* in motion. Teachers selected books for each grade level that focused on character traits and behaviors that contribute to student success in school and in life, such as kindness, tolerance, and eliminating bullying. To support this partnership, the LRSD superintendent attended many of the pastors' sessions with children across the grades. Principals began requesting pastors come to their schools to read aloud with their students. Fall Family Engagement Literacy Night was planned by the ATP of **St. James-Santee Elementary-Middle School, Charleston County School District, McClellan, South Carolina** and reported by **Rosetta Swinton, Family Service Specialist**. The ATP sent invitations in English and Spanish to all families. A local business partner donated dinner for all attendees. The program featured read-aloud stories and time to figure out letter-sound puzzles that children and parents could do at home. Each family also received a bag of produce donated by the local food bank. A guest speaker from the State Board of Education presented information to help parents see how to “coach” their children to enjoy reading at home and during vacations with fun-activities and discussions. Parents also made a few take-home resources to use with their children. At the Fall Literacy Night, teachers met with parents and addressed questions about their children’s learning. A school counselor assisted with information on how the school was addressing students’ Social Emotional Learning (SEL) skills across grade levels, and how parents could reinforce those skills at home.
