



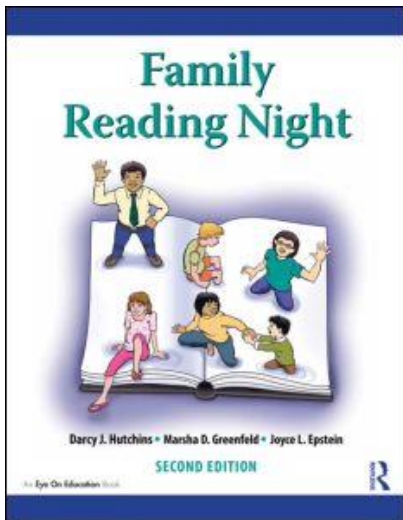
## National Network of Partnership Schools (NNPS) 2023 November E-Brief for Schools in NNPS

**Tools You Can Use.**



The NNPS book, *Family Reading Night* (2<sup>nd</sup> edition, 2015 by D. Hutchins, M Greenfeld, and J. Epstein) is a treasure trove of good ideas. Many schools conduct activities to engage families with students on reading in fun ways, but struggle to conduct a good *Family Reading Night*. This book helps you organize these gatherings in person or online for different genres to help students at all elementary grades read different kinds of stories. Each chapter provides activities in English and Spanish for **Scary Stories, Funny Books, Biographies, Celebrations / Traditions, Poetry**, and more.

**Why is this a good tool to use?** Each chapter lists for teachers the specific *reading standards* and students' *reading and literacy skills* are addressed by the activities that are outlined. Each chapter includes whole group activities (for students and family members) and student presentations for grades K-2 and 3-5. These can be adapted for the middle grades. ***All Roads Lead Home*** was conducted by **Columbia High School (CHS)** in Richland County, South Carolina, reported by **Yolanda Smith, Parent and Family Engagement Specialist**. The school's Action Team for Partnerships (ATP), Parent and Family Engagement Specialist, and other teachers and leaders had a good idea for building connections with "the community." They focused on their *alumni community* to create a more organized way to contact *all* of the high school's alumni with a strong and active Alumni Association for the school. This group would demonstrate the value of the school's past graduates and support current and future students. The planners, including active alumni, planned a kickoff activity. They invited alums from all graduating classes to come to the school to recall memories, celebrate the school, and plan improvements.

Everyone at the school pitched in to contact alums. Current students talked with their parents, family members, and neighbors who attended CHS in the past. Students also set up a yearbook display to prompt many memories. ROTC students provided security for the activity. Teachers contacted alumni they knew, including some prior faculty at CHS. The principal and assistant principal served as advisors. The new Alumni Association initiated several exciting programs (e.g., alumni volunteers and mentors, scholarships for future graduates; a Career Fair, to improve student attendance, graduation rates, college and career plans, and more.

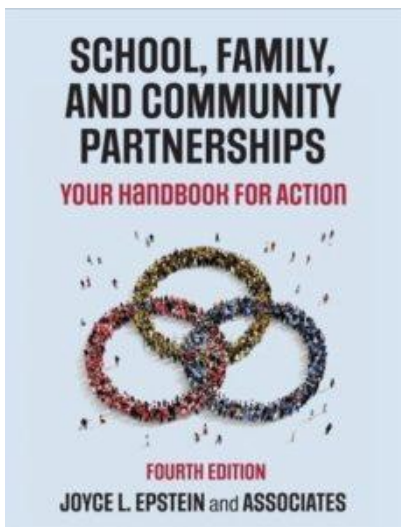

engagement (often “too much information”) that is “out there.” You will be able to pick and choose other information to enhance your own partnership program—always keeping in mind the goal for good partnerships *in all schools, with all families, and for all students*.
