December marks the end of the calendar year.


It's time for a winter holiday. That's worth a cheer!

The NNPS book, *Multicultural Partnerships: Involve All Families* (by Hutchins, Greenfeld, Epstein, Sanders, & Galindo, 2012) is an important and useful resource. Just about all districts and schools in NNPS serve highly diverse populations of students and families. This book includes a summary of research on the importance of engaging *all* families as partners in children's education. It offers many ideas and examples of activities to celebrate diversity at school and at home with Multicultural Nights, Workshops for Parents, and Connections with the Curriculum.

Why is this a good tool to use? Each chapter provides details on the purposes, materials, planning, and guidelines for conducting fun, responsive, and effective activities with diverse families. See how to feature students' artwork, engage parents in sharing childhood games and favorite stories, spotlight students' projects in reading, math, social studies, and more. All family engagement activities are in English and Spanish. The partnership practices in this book will enable you to recognize the strengths of all cultures and enable all families to support student learning at school and at home. See Multicultural

Enhanced Communication: Kick It Up A Notch! was reported by Esmeralda Valencia, Parent Engagement Coordinator, Kassy Valdez, Parent Partnership Coordinator, and Lorraine Landon, Special Programs Coordinator, Pasco School District One in Pasco, WA. The district leaders encouraged every school to help all of their families know about the work of their school's Action Team for Partnerships (ATP) and how to participate as an active partner at school and at home. The district leaders guided schools to use two tools: (1) renewable trifold display boards to show parents all of their partnership plans and activities for the year; and (2) a "timeless" audio recording on the work of the school's ATP.

Pasco's schools were creative. They decorated their trifolds with school colors, mascots, photos, ATP meeting dates, volunteer opportunities, and schedules of partnership activities for the school year. Some schools posted QR codes for families to link to the school's website, teachers, and administrators. The partnership leaders and colleagues collaborated with a local radio station DJ to produce a 60-second audio message in English and in Spanish about the work of each school's ATP.

We Both Read: Books and Blankets at A. J. Lewis Greenview Elementary School in Columbia, SC, was reported by Glenda Wright, Family Service Advocate, in Richland County School District One.

Greenview works hard to improve students' literacy skills and attitudes. Last year, one family engagement activity focused on 40 students who would benefit from extra TLC in reading. Teachers introduced parents and students to the *We Both Read* books that guide shared reading strategies. For example, parents read the left hand page of a prepared book and students read the right hand page. They talk together about the story ideas, characters, and illustrations. Community partners donated cookies, hot chocolate, and blankets, which each family could keep for cozy reading at home. This is a "forever" item on many teachers' agendas at all grade levels. *Books and Blankets* added a family engagement strategy to support the importance of students' reading for pleasure at home.
